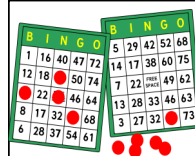

**BAPTISMAL PREPARATION COURSE:** Parents requesting Baptism for their child are required to attend a Pre Baptismal Course to be held in the Kavanagh Room on Sunday morning, September 30th. after the 10 a.m. Mass. The practice in parishes is now normal procedure and is so very much appreciated by the parents who attend. No arrangements can be made for a Baptism until such a course has been attended. It is recommended that Parents should consider coming whilst Mum is expecting Baby. In our Parish, the general intention is to have such a course every quarter, so there can be no excuse for anybody not attending or not knowing about such courses. The course will be based mostly on a Video, with ample opportunity to ask questions throughout. Will regular Church Attenders please inform any member of your family or friends, who may not be in frequent contact with the Church, about these essential Preparation courses. Thank you.

**PRIESTS ON THE MOVE:** In our Deanery this coming week, it is a time of welcome and goodbye. First of all we say goodbye to Fr. Marcell, who has been Parish Priest at Our Lady's Parish, Rushey Mead for the past 20 years plus. After faithful and deeply spiritual service, Fr. Marcel is retiring. We wish him a long and happy retirement. Also retiring (or has retired recently) is Fr. Stephen Foster, from St. Mary's, St. Wigston. Unfortunately Fr. Stephen's poor health has forced his retirement. He is now living in a Nursing Home in Derby, and is being well cared for in his time of need. Our prayers are with him. Fr. Martin Hardy, who has been Parish Priest at St. Patrick's in Leicester for a number of years, is being transferred to Melton Mowbray as Parish Priest there. Again we wish him well. Fr. Daniel Palmer, who has been an Assistant Priest at Hinkley, is now being transferred to Glossop, as a roaming Assistant for the Deanery. More news on their replacements when to hand.

**DATA PROTECTION REGULATIONS:** Data Protection Regulations now in force require changes to the way we can record information and disseminate it in the newsletter. We must have the permission of the person concerned before we can include their name in the list of prayers for the sick, or have a Mass celebrated for their recovery (we can still have a mass said for their intentions) We can only hold information about you as parishioners, which you wish us to have; otherwise it must be destroyed. We must put a 'privacy notice' on all requests for information. **Privacy Notice.** The personal information which we hold about parishioners is solely for the purpose of parish administration. We will only contact you by means

which you have agreed that we may use for this purpose. You have the right to know what information the parish holds about you, but you do not have the right to see any of the parish registers. We will not give personal information about you to any other organisation. If we need to collect more detailed information (for marriage, baptism, etc.) this information will only be used for that specific purpose. The 'Data Controller' is the Diocese of Nottingham

**PARISH CENSUS:** The Data Protection regulations mean that the database in our parish will have to be destroyed, and replaced by another one, which we will need to create. Consequently, our Parish Pastoral Council will have to conduct a survey, where the cooperation of every parishioner will be absolutely necessary. It will be a fresh start for the entire parish, for parishioners who have lived here for years and for all, irrespective of how long you have lived in the parish. to comply with the Data regulations. We will have to have a Parish census requesting the information you feel you can give, and with your permission, to store and use it for Parish Administration purpose only. More on this in the near future.

This very weekend **THE EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS** is being held in Liverpool. A Eucharistic Congress is a coming together of all the faithful - clergy, religious, laity - which celebrates and promotes a greater awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Church. The last international Eucharistic Congress in England was held in 1908. The Congress this weekend organised by the Hierarchy, will be the first National Congress held in England and Wales. As well as formal the Congress programme, there is also parallel programmes made up of talks, discussion, workshops, prayerful opportunities, cultural events and much more.

A number of speakers famed in the Catholic Church, will be among the main speakers at the Congress. Our Parish representatives - Judith Snaith and Peter Green will report back to our Parish on their assessment, impressions and fruits of the Congress as they saw and experienced it.
