

THE NEW DATA PROTECTION ACT: A registration form to comply with the new Data protection Act has now been prepared for our parish, approved by the Diocese and accepted by our Parish Pastoral Council. Beginning in January every family in our Parish, or attached to our parish, will be invited to fill in a registration form.

THE PURPOSE OF REGISTRATION:

The purpose of storing this data is to assist in the administration of the parish. The information also helps the priest in his pastoral role, e.g. at times of bereavement or family emergencies.

DATA PROTECTION:

All data is stored securely on computer and access is limited to the Parish Priest and a small number of people authorised by the priest, to assist with parish administration. **The Diocese remains the sole Data Controller** (i.e. has responsibility for the use and control of this data), even where processing is carried out by parishes.
