
JOHN VANIER R.I.P. The death of JEAN VANIER was announced last week and many reports of his death, in print and verbally, described him as a living saint. Jean Vanier was the founder of L'ARCHE, the international community for people with learning disabilities. His writings and spoken word, touched the lives and hearts of people all over the world and his deep spiritual reflections will have drawn many, many souls closer to God, and given all with disabilities, a special dignity and quality of life, that will have, and will in the future, allow them to take their place in life with pride, worth, and committed engagement, in work and recreational places,



side by side, with men and women of all and every ability and contribution.

<u>Cardinal Vincent Nichols</u> said "For over half a century, he has inspired an entirely new appreciation of the gifts of people with learning disabilities, and revealed the most profound heart of human community."

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, who met Dr Vanier on a number of occasions said "Jean Vanier lived the Gospel in such a beautiful way, that few who met him, could fail to be caught up in it....The heart of his profound discipleship was to foster communities of love and fellowship, where people carry each others burdens, accept each others gifts and limitations - and find belonging, joy and healing."
