

SAFEGUARDING SUNDAY: A Letter for Safeguarding Sunday from Bishop Patrick

Today is Safeguarding Sunday, an opportunity to reflect a little on our ongoing journey as a diocese to build a safer environment for every person. You will recall that the Elliott review in 2020 recommended that the Catholic Church in England and Wales put in place a national Safeguarding body. In July 2021 the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency was formed. Its task is to ensure that all dioceses are regulated to meet the national standards in Safeguarding. As a diocese, we have worked well to develop clear structures and guidance for our Safeguarding practices so as to help ensure safe environments through the promotion of best practice. This has included, regular training in Safeguarding for the clergy, diocesan staff and parish volunteers; ensuring that everyone is safely recruited; that victims and survivors are carefully listened to and supported, and that we are always transparent and accountable in the way that allegations and concerns are managed effectively. I welcome this opportunity to thank our central Safeguarding team, Rachael Campion, Alan Booth and Jane Black, for all their good work. I would also like to express my gratitude to the parish Safeguarding Representatives for their hard work and commitment. Through them we are now embedding excellent Safeguarding practice across our parishes and chaplaincies to make our churches safe and welcoming. The diocesan website has all our Safeguarding information and the support that is offered to our parishes and chaplaincies.

Finally, thank you for all that you each do to help ensure that our churches are safe and welcoming. I say this because we cannot simply delegate this duty to parish Safeguarding Representatives or the Diocesan Safeguarding Team. Keeping everyone safe is part and parcel of the DNA of every Christian; an essential characteristic of our identity as Christ's followers, and so it must be reflected in the way we respect, protect, and treat each other with care. Only if each one of us is engaged in this way of thinking and acting can we continue to embed a culture of safeguarding throughout our diocese. Your parish has 2 people who have generously volunteered to help support the parish community in making your church a safe place to be, particularly for children, young people and vulnerable adults. But building this safe culture in our parishes can't just be left to them – it is the responsibility of all of us. Today, I urge everyone to give your parish reps your full support. Please join with them in fostering a deeper and more evident culture of safeguarding, care and protection for everyone in your parish. We can all play our part in ensuring that every single individual feels respected, safe, and loved, just as Our Lord asked of us: "as long as we love one another God will live in us and his love will be complete in us." This weekend we have a 2nd Collection for World Communications Sunday for the Communications work of the Church in England and Wales

FR CHRIS WRITES: Dear All, I had a good couple of days at the Clergy Conference which was stimulating as well as a good get together of the clergy – priests and deacons. We have talks from Bishop John Sherrington auxiliary in Westminster and a former priest of our Diocese. He is the lead on ethical & Life issues. His talk was entitled for the love of Christ urges us on. He talked about the cultural situation we live in and the relationship between truth and mercy and how they interact in the context of the Synod. He referred to one of the statements of our English summary which was carried on to the continental Document. The need for a formation that holds in tension scripture tradition and the teaching of the Church with personal experience and the invitation to an ongoing conversion. He also touched all their importance of encountering Christ for a true witness. He also reflected on the issue of euthanasia and how it is becoming more widespread each year across the world and the Christian response to the human being in their suffering and their great dignity. He also reflected on the Pope's letter on the family and various pastoral situations that we encounter and how we help people to grow as Christians through those difficulties. He was wonderful and in good form. We also had a talk from Kerri Christopher from the Humanum institute entitled What is Woman. This was a less heavy presentation but very helpful on the human embodiment and the truth that God made us as a man or woman.

We then had a very powerful talk and witness from Rachael Mackenzie from Rachel's Vineyard who helps those who have had abortion and has a ministry of healing whether for women or men who have been scarred by abortion. She herself had two abortions. This was a most powerful witness of hope, healing and forgiveness and the grieving of Mothers and Fathers for the Children they have killed who find a new hope and meaning for their lives. Words of John Paul II: Pope Saint John Paul II's Message to Women who've had an abortion: *"I would now like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision and she does not doubt that in many cases, it was a painful even shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not yet have healed... But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. Try rather to understand what happened and face it honestly."* www.rachelsvineyard.org.uk Sadly I had to return on Wednesday morning which was to look at Gender ideology from different perspectives. From Church teaching to pastoral care and legal issues in our work.

This Sunday we find ourselves between the Ascension which we celebrated last Thursday and the Feast of Pentecost which comes next Sunday. We are in the same period as was that first Christian Community as they gathered in the Upper Room- the cenacle- as they awaited the words of Jesus concerning the coming of the Holy Spirit to be fulfilled. We should be like them: praying continuously. There is that great tradition of the Church of Making a Novena to the Holy Spirit – nine days of prayer asking for the Gift of the Holy Spirit. I love the psalm which is the first Psalm of the Easter Vigil: Send forth your spirit O Lord and renew the face of the earth. Let us get on our knees each of us, and together as families and ask God to send forth his Holy Spirit and renew each of us, our families, our Church, our World. That little as we are through the power of the Holy Spirit we can accomplish great things.(cf. Mary's Magnificat).

It is still a "literal translation" (As opposed to something like the Good news version which tends towards paraphrase and interpretation) . The present lectionary was published in 1981. There will be readings etc for the New Saints and updated readings for the Sacraments. I hope this helps you if you are thinking about buying a new Missal!
