

FR CHRIS WRITES: This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Many will think of this as an abstract theological conundrum! But in fact it is the centre of our faith. The truth of the Holy Trinity that God is a communion of love gives the structure and form for everything of faith and indeed human life. He is the answer to Life the Universe and everything to guote the expression of that wonderful Hitch-hikers guide to the Galaxy. God is a God of love indeed his very nature is love formed by the eternal relationships of love of the father Son & holy Spirit. . For example we as human beings are made in his image and likeness. Each of us is a human person, made up of body and soul. In that personhood we reflect the image of god and are called to reflect it more and more though giving and receiving love.

DAY FOR LIFE: Sunday 18th June The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. In England and Wales, Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year. For the first time, it will be celebrated in Scotland and Ireland on the same day. The theme is 'Listen to Her' and focuses on post-abortion trauma and the impact of abortion primarily on women, but also men and others.

The translation will be The English Standard Version Catholic edition. The psalms will be a new Grail version called Abbey Psalms and Canticles. Currently the readings are from the Jerusalem Bible and some Revised Standard Version. The ESV is a renewal of the RSV. It is still a "literal translation" (As opposed to something like the Good news version which tends towards paraphrase and interpretation). The present lectionary was published in 1981. There will be readings etc for the News Saints and updated readings for the Sacraments. I hope this helps you if you are thinking about buying a new Missal!
