I also would like to say congratulations to Fr Stephen Dye who celebrated his Silver Jubilee this week. He was a Curate here with Fr Jim Cahill. Sadly, Fr Kevin Gradwell died on Saturday. A truly lovely man. May he rest in peace.

SEA SUNDAY THIS WEEKEND 2nd COLLECTION: Seafarers and fishers Play a vital role in all of our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions. In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. There are less priests now and many Parishes in Leicester are sharing a Priest sometimes two Parishes, sometimes three. The diocesan plan for our Parish of Market Harborough leaves us as a single Parish. However, I have to be able to support other Parishes on occasion such as sickness.

We have decided now to return to our traditional time of 10.00am on Sunday morning as well as the 6.00pm Saturday night from the weekend of 16/17<sup>th</sup> September. We have discerned that this is the best time for the Parish. However, if the needs of the Deanery demand it in the future, we may have to move to another time. We are blessed that we will have 2 weekend Masses at our Parish when many just have one. My thanks for all who have helped discern this decision.
