FR CHRIS: THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS:

Today we complete our Christmas celebrations with the feast of Our Lord's Baptism, his "Epiphany" by the river Jordan in which he manifests or reveals himself as our true God and true Saviour. More now is revealed about Jesus who was made manifest in Bethlehem to the Shepherds and the Wise Men as God of Jew and Gentile. We might wonder why he was baptised by John. Indeed, John was shocked by that very thing. It seems the wrong way round. John's Baptism was a Baptism of repentance for sins committed. Jesus was sinless he had no need of repentance. He goes down into the river precisely to take on our sins, for as John had said he is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He takes them away by taking them on himself. He does so right at the beginning of 3 years of Public Ministry. We must read all that he says and does in this light. The road to the cross is already mapped out. He goes down into the water. Water can be dangerous and deadly and, in this aspect, represents his descent to death and particularly the death of sin which he will take on for us as the Lamb of God.

He does this so that the waters of death will now become life giving waters in Baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit which pours forth from the heart of Jesus when he is pierced by a lance on the cross. Our first reading and Psalm both from Isaiah are filled with a prophetic joy for this. Oh, come to the water all you who are thirsty; though you have no money, come. With iov you will draw water from the wells of salvation. We notice both these texts feature in the joy of the Easter Vigil. By entering the waters of death, he makes them holy.

And so, it is that we have the great epiphany of Jesus as he rises out of the Waters as the beloved son of the Father on whom the Holy Spirit descends. This revelation is an unveiling of Christ's being. It is not that he receives the Spirit he lacks (still less that he becomes divine at this moment) but his being is made manifest as son of God, one God with the Father and Holy Spirit.

It is also an epiphany of who we are as Christians by our Baptism. We are beloved children of the Father, made so by the Holy Spirit who has descended on us in Baptism. We share in the divine life and love which the father and Son share, poured forth on the Cross.

St John tells us our faith is our victory over the world. The world in the sense of all that comes from evil and sin. Faith in Christ leads to a divine rebirth in Baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit enables us to conquer our sin the Devil and death itself. We do this through the power of the Holv Sprit. This is our joy.

So, as we look at Christ as he ascends from the River Jordan, we see all our possibilities as Christians rise up from the waters of death. As we look at him with eves of our heart in faith, we are filled hope both for ourselves and our world. In him the victory is already present, and we share in it already as Baptised Christians through the power of the Holy Spirit. So we too, are invited indeed called to mission and witness in our lives as Christ was.



Sadly, the Coronavirus continues to circulate and we again have a national lockdown with our schools closed. However, the good news is that this time our Churches are permitted to remain open for Mass, thanks to the ministry of our Stewards.

I remind people that the Sunday Mass obligation is suspended and that people who consider themselves vulnerable though age or medical condition should remain at home.

We must continue to be as safe as we can whilst attending church. I ask people to cooperate with our Stewards in all their directions and particularly we should not mix with anyone outside our "bubble". We can be tempted to have a quick catch up! We should also thoroughly wash our hands before we come to Mass and sanitize them on entry and exit.

Due to the restrictions, we have fewer Stewards and so have to make some changes from now on:

- You should not turn up for Mass if you feel unwell particularly if you experience a new • persistent cough, a high temperature, or a change in your sense of smell or taste.
- All must enter the Church through the through the Fairfield Rd door •
- Please come in good time so we do not have large gatherings.at the last minute.
- Please sit where you are shown by the stewards for safety reasons. You can no linger choose which side.
- Our Lady's side to leave by the Coventry Road door and Sacred Heart side from Fairfield road.
- Please do not stop and linger near the doors as this is unsafe and causes a hold up for people leaving.
- Please do not mix with people outside your bubble .
- Remember to always keep your 2m distance and remember there is no rush to leave Church.
