

We welcome Bishop Patrick this weekend who is coming to celebrate our Masses.

FR CHRIS WRITES: I was delighted to receive a call from Bishop Patrick on Monday asking if he could join us for our Masses this weekend. He tries to join Parishes for Mass when he has a free weekend. He is a true Pastor as a Parish Priest at heart. It is wonderful to welcome the true Shepherd of our local Church, and successor to the Apostles who lead us to encounter, Christ be his disciples and share our faith, as missionary disciples.

This weekend we celebrate the **SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST**. This feast which we celebrate sprang from the faith of Christians in the abiding real presence of Christ in the Eucharist in our churches and chapels. This solemnity which began in 1246 and spread to the whole church expresses so many things but Above all the abiding presence of Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist. We also pray for our eucharistic Ministers who serve the Parish so faithfully as they renew their commitment..

AS YOU KNOW WE'VE BEEN SEEKING TENANTS FOR THE CLUB NEXT TO CHURCH TO RENT. We and the Diocese have agreed tenants who are beauticians. Last week they received planning permission for change of use and have signed a lease of the buildings. The lease is handled by Eddisons (incorporating Budworth Hardcastle). I thank them for their professional work and the Diocese who deal with all these things particularly Rachael Oxspring and our PPC, especially John O'Leary whose advice and insight has been invaluable. We will receive a healthy rent. I do not know if the Car Park will be available for Mass. That will be a decision for the tenants
A question was raised about finances recently. In Canon Law all our income belongs to the Parish whether collections or fundraising such as the Bazaar. However we do pay a quota each month to support the mission of the Diocese based on our collections and any rental income such as the Club.

DAY FOR LIFE: Sunday 18th June The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. In England and Wales, Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year. For the first time, it will be celebrated in Scotland and Ireland on the same day. The theme is 'Listen to Her' and focuses on post-abortion trauma and the impact of abortion primarily on women, but also men and others. 2nd Collection next week.
