FR CHRIS: THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS:

The scene is at the Jordan. John the Baptist is baptising in preparation for the Coming Messiah. He calls people to prepare by repenting. There is great religious fervour amongst the people. They are excited and hope! Is this the moment they have been waiting for all these centuries? Especially the last ones when there had not been a prophet to guide them even though so often did not listen! The religious leaders wonder what is going one. They come enquiring. I do not know if it from malice or just concern and interest. They have had false Messiahs before.

John clears that up for them: he is not the Messiah. He is not the light as we hear in the first part of the Gospel which is taken from the Prologue. (Note always look at the verses as often the readings at Mass jump verses.) He says he is not the Christ or even the precursor at least as they understand it: Elijah or the prophet expected to pave the way. But he points to the light, he is preparing the way for the light.

No religious leader be they Pope, Bishop or priest indeed nor any Christian can take the place of Christ. We must always point to him and him alone. He is the light. Nor should we base our faith on such people. Certainly, they can help our faith, but they are human and can fail and let us down. Our recent History is replete with that. Be they priests or charismatic lay leaders. I think we have a sense of that as Catholics. We see the priest in persona Christi, not for his talents or even holiness (or lack of it) but because of his ordination. That indeed, despite his failings, Christ works through him to bring grace and holiness. But holiness helps! Pray for priests! May we all point to Christ who is our joy.

And that is the theme today on Gaudete Sunday. John rejoices that he can point to the light of the world present amongst them at last. He rejoices that he must decrease and Christ increase. We sometimes think of John as severe because he calls to repentance in no uncertain terms, but he knows repentance is the precursor to joy! Confession this Advent! St Paul gives some advice for Joy for always rejoicing indeed: to pray constantly. To pray constantly comes from having our regular times of prayer each day. This imbues our whole day with prayer. He tells us to give thanks. To give thanks reminds us that we are blessed which gives joy. We must listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit whatever they are. Often they challenge us out of our laziness or selfishness to great sacrifice. We must not supress this impulse. I think counsellors etc often talk about suppression as a bad thing. Well, certainly we should not suppress the Holy Spirit who is the joy of God.

Indeed, it is the Holy Sprit who fills the servant with Joy in the first reading as he lets the Spirit fill him and move him to his mission to the poor, the broken hearted, the captives. He rejoices in doing the will of God and because God has clothed him with the garments of salvation. We too rejoice that we have been clothed in Christ through our Baptism and received the Holy Spirit.

The one filled with joy above all is Mary as we pray the Magnificat as our Psalm. She is the one whose soul is most receptive to the Holy Spirit and obedient to him and so most filled with joy. We spend these last days of advent with Mary. As we meditate on her prayer let us make it our own. For God desires to do marvels for us.
