WELL DONE PAUL AND THANK YOU:

For a number of years, our church lighting has been something of a problem with continuous bulb failings, cost of replacing and danger and difficulty involved. A solution had to be found and it was, when that particular type of light fitting became no longer obtainable and no longer legal under EEC law. Paul Nelson was asked by our Parish Pastoral Council to investigate and report to the P.P.C. and to the Diocesan Trustees. Having presented his report to the P.P.C.

and the Diocese, he was authorised to proceed. A lighting consultant was employed, a scheme was drawn up and was acceptable to the Diocese. A tender was accepted from 3 tenders submitted. Work was scheduled to start in February. With an unforeseen delay in delivery of the new fittings and the scourge of Covid-19, work was delayed until a month ago. It is now almost completed and has given a particular and different brightness and lighting to our church. For your information and interest the old lighting system consumed 17,200 watts. The new lighting system consumes 1,650 watts. This as you can see is a saving of 90%. Furthermore, all the bulbs are now LED and thus, we have become greener and sympathetic towards our environment. We can now be categorised as a "Green Church". This past month was entirely driven, managed and successfully completed under Paul's gentle direction, competence and professionalism. God bless you Paul and on my own behalf and on the behalf of the entire parish, thank you; thank you; thank you.
