FR CHRIS'S THOUGHTS FOR SUNDAY:

Today we listen to the wonderful greetings of Saint Elizabeth to her cousin Mary. Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb and the third blessing: blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled. We join with Elizabeth in praising Mary because in her we see the wonders of God's grace at work in a unique way, yes, but as a sign for us all.

Blessed are you amongst women! She is indeed blessed in so many ways and we greet her happily as our spiritual mother because she is the Mother of God and as Jesus's brothers and sisters, she is our mother too. Blessed because of what or better who she carries in her womb: the very son Of God. She is the true and living Ark of the Covenant carrying in her no mere tablets of stone but God himself amongst men & women. As she did for Elizabeth & John the Baptist, we ask Mary to bring her Son to us too. Indeed, to hurry and bring him to us this Christmas, that we may truly greet him and rejoice as did those two great figures of the Old Testament. That we may say with all our heart mind and soul: blessed is the fruit of your womb. For that is what gives her the greatest joy that we may know her son, that we may rejoice in him: she desires to share her joy in him with us. Is not that most wonderful? What a mother we have in Mary! May she visit to us in these last days of Advent so that we too can say: Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? But Mary is blessed again by Elizabeth because of her faith. Here we have the other key to Mary's blessedness: She had been greeted by the angel. Hail full of grace is the greeting and the title she received, and she was indeed full of grace, the most highly favoured lady, but here we hear the other element that must go with grace: if grace is to fulfil its purpose faith is needed to respond to the gift of God and Mary responded with the entire openness of herself to the gift. Indeed, faith is perfectly realised in Mary: "The obedience of faith' (Rom. 16:26: cf. Rom. 1:5; 2 Cor. 10:5-6) must be given to God who reveals, an obedience by which a man or woman entrusts his or her whole self freely to God." This is most true of Mary She says let it be done to me according to your word in response to the Angel. She gives indeed her decisive response on a human level for God to accomplish his purpose. There is a complete harmony with the words of the Son, who, according to the Letter to the Hebrews. says to the Father as he comes into the world: "Sacrifices and offering you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me.... Lo, I have come to do your will, O God" (Heb. 10:5-7). She gives her yes through grace - the same yes of obedience that Christ gives and through Christ we too can give that same yes. And here we have it. Here I am Lord I come to do your will: this is what is asked of us in response to God's grace. To open ourselves to God with all our heart mind and soul all our being - without reserve like Mary. We indeed praise Mary for her faith which began our salvation: her faith which continued to grow all during her life her faith in which she so totally abandoned herself to the Word of God that she embraced the very mystery of her Son's death on the cross in complete trust. So today we greet Mary, of all women the most blessed. We greet with her the fruit of her womb, Jesus – that we may be filled with the same joy and we ask her motherly intercession for our faith: that we may respond to the great graces God gives us as we pray in the Mass & each day in the angelus: Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts


