#### FR CHRIS: THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS:

Our Psalm today expresses a beautiful prayer:

Lord, make me know your ways. Lord, teach me your paths. Make me walk in your truth and teach me: for you are God my saviour.

That should be our burning prayer. That we should know the ways of God, and not only know them, asking God to teach us, but walk in the way of his truth. This is because we believe and confess that God is our saviour. We desire to know and love God and because he is everything his ways are the ways of truth and thus life. As Christians we believe that. So, we should set about that. How do we know his ways and walk with him.?

Like Jonah in today's Old testament reading, we have to listen to the word of God and obey it. That word comes to us in a most special way in the written and inspired word of God. Our Scriptures. Today we are celebrating Word of God Sunday which celebrates the gift of the written word of God in the scriptures. Scripture is unique as the written and inspired word of God that we can take in our hands and read or listen to. It is the word of God. We say this so easily at the end of the readings at Mass: the word of the Lord and we respond: thanks be to God. Do we really believe what we say and are we filled with thanks? We would be if we regularly read and prayed the scriptures.

God speaks to us in the scriptures for they have God as their author as the authors were inspired by the Holy Spirit to write as he willed. Yet such is the mystery of scripture that parallels in a certain way the incarnation that "To compose the sacred books, God chose certain men who, all the while he employed them in this task, made full use of their own faculties and powers so that, though he acted in them and by them, it was as true authors that they consigned to writing whatever he wanted written, and no more. (Cf Dei Verbum11 & CCC106) The scriptures were not dictated by God but he inspired the authors to write as he intended but using all their human faculties .This Scripture is both divine and human like Christ, and so most suited to our needs both close to us and from God.

And because it is inspired it is alive. The Christian faith is not a religion of the book but of the word of God who is alive and active. It is both inspired by the Holy Spirit and inspiring to us by the Holy Spirit who is all vitality. Because it is inspired it teaches us the truth. As the Church teaches us: Since therefore all that the inspired authors or sacred writers affirm should be regarded as affirmed by the Holy Spirit, we must acknowledge that the books of Scripture firmly, faithfully, and without error teach that truth which God, for the sake of our salvation. wished to see confided to the Sacred Scriptures (Cf Dei Verbum11 & CCC107).

As inspiring it moves us to do the will of God and follow him as did those first disciples on hearing Jesus calling to them. "Such is the force and power of the Word of God that it can serve the Church as her support and vigour, and the children of the Church as strength for their faith, food for the soul, and a pure and lasting fount of spiritual life (Cf Dei Verbum 22 & CCC131). Jonah was a reluctant prophet. He did not want to go to Nineveh, Yet the word of God moved him and changed him because he listen and obeyed however reluctantly. It can do the same for us!

Do we read the scriptures? Do we read the bible Stories to our children? Do we read scripture everyday whether reading a bit from s particular book everyday or follow the Church daily readings at Mass? Do we place the bible in our homes in a worthy place?

# **NEW LECTIONARY FOR ENGLAND AND WALES:**

For a number of years the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have been considering the publication of a new edition of the Lectionary used in Mass to replace that originally published in the year 1969 (second edition 1981). After consultation with a number of English-speaking Conferences of Bishops, the Bishops of England and Wales studied the translation of the Catholic Edition of the English Standard Version (ESV) of the Bible produced by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India. They approved this in 2018. It is based on the RSV. It is expected that the bishops will complete their approval process in Autumn 2021. The text will then need to be reviewed by the Holy See and others. The earliest date for publication would therefore be in 2022. PS Another change has already occurred in the Liturgy. The translation of the ending of the Opening prayer or Collect. It now says Through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever instead of One God for ever and ever. It was incorrect as it refers to the Son and the translation could therefore be misconstrued.
