FR CHRIS'S THOUGHTS FOR SUNDAY:

Today we commence the reading of John 6 on the Bread of life over the next few weeks but also today we celebrate the World Day for grandparents and the elderly instituted by the Holy Father. In the miracle Jesus feeds a vast Crowd over 5000 people that had gathered to listen to him in a miracle that is a sign of the Mass through the ages when we gather to listen to Jesus's word and be feed by him with the bread of life. That crowd was made up of all sorts including the young and the elderly as are our Sunday Mass Communities with all age groups and we all form and are necessary to the Body of Christ the Church. We are all one body with one Spirit and share the same hope. This truth means we have all much to give. The Holy Father today wants to underline the vital role of Grandparents and the elderly within our Church especially towards the young. This is the beauty of the Church family. We are not saved alone. We need each other as indeed did Jesus need the small boy with the bread and fishes. The scene presented in the Gospel helps us to understand how, even in everyday family life, whatever each of us possesses can be a great resource for all of us. "The elderly are not saved by themselves alone because they need strong legs on which to make their dreams walk. Young people are not saved by themselves alone because they need someone to tell them that even from a dark night, the sun of a new dawn can rise." What gifts could we share as elderly? What can they give to the Lord for him to bless & multiply? The Holy Father shares some thoughts in his wonderful message. We are all labourers in the vineyard even if we are a great age for we are filled with the Holy Spirit who is eternal youth and freshness. The elderly have great gifts. Grandparents, then, have the specific task of transmitting the faith to the younger generations and accompanying their grandchildren with their wisdom of lived experience. They need to help them to avoid losing touch with their roots and to build their lives on solid foundations. Also there is the tenderness of grandparents. Their way of loving and pampering their grandchildren, to the point of spoiling them, may seem exaggerated to us, but exaggeration is the only measure of love as the Lord himself show in the multiplication of the loaves.

As we come out of the pandemic we need each other. The HF says: The future of the world depends on this covenant between young and old. Who, if not the young, can take the dreams of the elderly and make them come true? The dreams of the elderly of a better more just and loving world can enable the youth to have visions and give legs to the ideas. Also in the memory of grandparents and the elderly is the experience of difficulties lived through and overcome which can give hope to the young who may lose hope and be tempted to give in to cynicism. Then there are the two fishes of prayer and love which are there even for the most elderly and frail. As the Holy father says: "the prayer of the elderly can protect the world and help it perhaps more incisively than the toil of so many. Your prayer is a most precious resource: it is a lung of which the Church and the world cannot be deprived (cf. Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, 262). Especially at this time [...], your intercession for the world and for the Church is not in vain, but shows everyone the serene confidence of having a firm foothold.

FR CHRIS WRITES: Dear All, This weekend we celebrate the World Day of Grandparents and the elderly which Pope Francis has instituted as a special day each year around the Feast of St Joachim and Anna. Throughout his papacy Pope Francis has reminded us to value the many gifts of grandparents and the elderly. In his theme chosen for this inaugural year *I* am with you always, the Holy Father is highlighting that promise of closeness that generations share with each other. Not only are our young people called to be present in the lives of older people, but so too grandparents and elders have a mission to encourage young people on their faith journey. Our little domestic churches are always enriched by the inclusion of grandparents and elders.



"In the text of his inaugural message Pope Francis expands on this theme and assures us that he has been close to all those who have felt isolated and alone in recent months and that, even at the darkest of moments, the Lord continues to send angels to console our loneliness and to remind us that 'He is with us always'. Pope Francis tells us that these angels sent to console us will at times have the face of our grandchildren, while at other times, the face of family members, lifelong friends or those we have come to know during these trying times, when we have learned how important hugs and visits are for each of us.

Bishop Nulty from Ireland said, "There have been so many unsung heroes and heroines during the pandemic – grandparents and elders, including our older priests and religious – all who are to be applauded for how they have coped with the challenges and uncertainty brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic. As a society we have learned a lot from their stoicism and pragmatism in the face of so many challenges.

Covid 19: As you all know the Government removed regulations on Monday 19th July. However, the Virus is still about and the rate of infection remains high. So we need to proceed carefully and slowly. This is the opinion of those whom I have consulted. With the Delta variant on the rise in our areas *Hands, Face, Space, Ventilate* is just as important as ever.

So we will still have to wear **masks** in Church as before: this is to protect all concerned and is an act of Christian charity

There will still be the 2m **social distancing** in Church., even if we can relax the spacing a little in the future We will still **sanitise** hands as we enter and leave Church.

Stewards will operate at the weekend Masses with booking for Mass as we do now. However, **on weekdays** there will be only one steward who will still ask people to sign in or use the NHS Q code. **It will be easier if people book in online on a weekday**. On a weekday we will alternate sitting: on the Sacred Heart side on Tuesdays, Our Lady's on a Thursday and Sacred heart on a Friday. I think we are now all accustomed to how to act in a safe way. We will review this every few weeks in the light of local conditions.

Meanwhile we have been bringing the Hall up to standard with an inspection of the electrics of the Hall and House as well as a Health & safety review by an outside Consultant There is some upgrading to do on the electrics. As we are now coming out of lockdown we do **need a Parish Health & Safety representative** if someone could volunteer who has some relevant background.
