FR CHRIS: THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS:

As we begin the Church's year, we look forward to celebrating our Lord's birth. There are many themes to Advent: longing, expectation, alertness, hope and joy. All these are contained in the very word Advent which means arrival or coming. For us it is the coming of the Saviour in three ways. He who came, will come again and comes to us in the present. Today our readings touch on the longing of Israel for God to come and Jesus coming at the end of time. I will give a few thoughts on the first.

The prayer of Israel in Isaiah is one of my favourites: Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down! — at your Presence the mountains would melt. In a literal sense it is a prayer of Israel in exile longing for a New Exodus and return to the Promised Land, remembering the great theophany of God on Mount Sinai, when God made the Covenant with them. They need God's intervention once again to bring them home and rebuild themselves as his People. But it also reflects a deeper spiritual awakening that we see happening in the great prophets such as Ezekiel and Jeremiah. Israel is the chosen people blessed with the Covenant that makes them the People of God. Blessed in so many ways with God's favour. Yet they realise that again and again they have been unfaithful to the covenant. They are awakening to the fact that they cannot keep the covenant by themselves through their own will power. They need a new intervention of God to change their hearts and hence the wonderful prayer calling on God to come down. This gives birth to hope and with hope joy. Little could they know how God would answer that prayer.

But we know! That God himself would take on our nature and our sins and show how he indeed is the redeemer of his people. This prophecy is fulfilled with the birth of Christ and in a specific sense at the Baptism of our Lord which ends our Christmas season when the heavens are torn open and the Holy Spirit is seen to descend on the chosen one(cf the Psalm). It makes me think on how God always goes beyond any expectations or prayers we make. For indeed that same Holy Spirit that came on Jesus is given to us. Each day we should ask for the Holy Spirit to come down on us that he will shower his gifts on us.

Like the People of Israel, we must recognise that we cannot keep the New Covenant by will power alone. Indeed, without God's grace we would be without hope. Sin withers us like the leaves in Winter as Isaiah says today. We need to invite Jesus to come down to us and melt the hardness of our hearts. We cry out with the Psalmist today to be saved from our sins.

There are some lovely prayers in today's Psalm which we can pray individually or as a community seeking God's help: God of hosts, bring us back; let your face shine on us and we shall be saved....... O Lord rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help. ...Give us life that we may call upon your name. Over all we have the great Advent prayer: Come Lord Jesus come.....Come into my heart, into my soul, into our family, our Church our world....Come Lord Jesus come. Then hope will be born in us with joy following. May you all have a Blessed advent in preparation for Christmas.


