FR CHRIS'S THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS

TODAY WE honour and praise God the Most Holy Trinity, Father Son and Holy Spirit, One God. This is the highest and most important truth of our faith from which all Christian truth flows because it is the mystery of God in himself. God is a tripersonal Unity of Love. So, it is fitting that the last words of Jesus on earth are: Go, therefore, make disciples of



all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. We are called to teach about God and make disciples by Baptism in the name of the Trinity. God's self revelation reaches a finale in these words of Our Lord finishing the plan of the loving kindness of God that had begun with creation. The whole of the history of salvation is the story of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men and reconciles and makes one with himself all mankind.

There are hints of God early in this story of love as God is called Father by many religions as the creator of all who cares for his creatures and is the ultimate authority. For Israel as we have heard in the reading, he is the one and only God who choose Israel as his Son. But it is Jesus the Word of the Father made flesh who reveals that God in himself is eternally father by his relationship to the Son who, reciprocally, is Son only and eternally in relation to his Father. And then Jesus reveals especially at the last Supper the Holy Spirit who is their bond of love in Unity, the Advocate: the third person of the Holy trinity. Now he knows that we can never grasp this more than a little bit in our intellect because the mystery of God is infinite. Our theology tries with words which have meditated on this mystery over 2000 years yet knows we will always fall short. Yet he wants us to know God and his love. Not merely to know about God but to know him in his love.

Hence the command to Baptise: for in Baptism, we receive the Holy Spirit, who proceeds from the Father and the Son and is the fire of God's love. The Holy Spirit makes us Children of God who are able in the Spirit to cry out Abba, father as St Paul says. We know God not from the outside but from within by the Holy Spirit who with the Father and Son dwells within us and shares divine life with us. To Know God, we have to let the Holy Spirit transform us from within in love. He bears witness to this reality. To know God, we must let the Holy Spirit breathe on us and in us as we try to live the truth of love in the image and likeness of God. As revealed in the doctrine of the Trinity, the Love of God Himself is the total gift of self to another person: The father loves the Son from all eternity the Son loves the father from all eternity and their love is the Holy Spirit. We are called and inspired by the Spirit to live that truth and as St Paul says not without suffering. The total gift of self is painful for finite and sinful creatures because we cannot totally give ourselves without dying to sin. Yet as Pauls says we thus share in his glory.

So, what do we say? God's nature is love. Being for and from the other. We are made in the image and likeness of the triune God and so we can only find ourselves in being for and from others in love. As the second Vatican council says we can only find ourselves in the sincere gift of ourselves to the other; it is in love that we are fulfilled; it is in love that we experience and come to know and live profound truth of the wonder of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen.
