#### FR CHRIS'S THOUGHTS FOR SUNDAY

Today we rejoice in all the saints of all times who are now in heaven who surround the throne of God in communion with God and each other. As our second reading says they shall be like him for they shall she got actually really is. They shall see God as he really is. What a thing to look forward to! They now see God and sharing in fulness in his life and love. Knowing God, they understand the mystery of his love, the wonders of his care of his Providence at work in history and in their lives. For this reason they give praise and glory to God in adoration and worship in heavenly court . 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.' They know and give thanks. Their Amen is now total. These are the countless number of people who have responded to the grace of Christ in their lives, whether explicitly Christian or have listened to his voice in their conscience and done what is right despite the cost. They have begun again when they failed. We rejoice! These are people like us and no doubt many people we have known and loved.

Our first reading from the Book of revelation written during persecution of Christians trying to live their faith. They opposed the Roman empire by their way of living, with its immorality, its materialism, its consumerism, and above all its demand that all its subjects should worship the Emperor as Lord. The first Christians faced the test of remaining faithful to Christ everyday. The same decision stands before Christians in today's world. Who is my Lord. Christ or the standards for which the Emperor stood, carelessness about sexual morality, materialism, consumerism, putting myself first in everything without regard for the cost to others? Do I connive at and approve standards of behaviour which are built on a morality far from that of Christ? More pressingly, do I accept those standards for myself? Are we different from the spirit of the age? AS we think about the guestions the Bishop has put to us for the Synodal process, we ask ourselves if we witness as those first Christians did spreading the faith even in difficult times? For them it could cost their life.

Today's feast reminds us who we are truly are: we are already the children of God. That is our being in our truest depth. Sons and daughters of the Father brothers and sisters of Jesus. Sons are often like their Fathers, whether in looks gestures mannerisms etc. So should we, as sons and daughters of the Father, show the qualities of God in our actions: God's generosity, his forgiveness, his tender care for all especially the weakest.

We might ask ourselves what particular beatitude speaks to us today? What spiritual attitude of mind soul can we take on and live out in our lives?. Poverty of spirit, gentleness compassion with the suffering, mercy a pure way of looking at everybody and everything, makers of peace, and standing up for what is right especially for those least able to defend themselves.. All these will bring us to be more and more like God, that is to say truly who we are. Then we will not fear death but long for the final grace to be fully like him in all our being body and soul. St John in his letter leaves us with the challenge: Surely everyone who entertains this hope must purify himself, must try to be as pure as Christ.


